Dear Dr. Taitz:

This responds to your August 1, 2013 request under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. section 552, for records of the Department of the Treasury related to the U.S. Government's reported level of debt. As stated in our August 15 email to you, Treasury's Office of Disclosure Services assigned your request in part to the Office of Inspector General (OIG).

I have reviewed the record requests set out in paragraph 5.a – f of your August 1 letter. I have caused the OIG's investigative data base to be searched using the criteria in your request, and have determined that the OIG has no letters or other documentation from the persons or about the matters you describe, no investigative records on these matters, and no criminal complaints or referrals. Accordingly, I advise you that the OIG has no records responsive to your request.

If you disagree with this resolution of your FOIA request, you can appeal the matter pursuant to 5 U.S.C. section 552(a)(6)(A)(i). Pursuant to the Department's FOIA appeal process set forth in 31 C.F.R. section 1.5(i), an appeal must be submitted within 35 days from the date of this response to your request, signed by you and addressed to: Freedom of Information Act Appeal, DO, Disclosure Services, Department of the Treasury, Washington, D.C. 20020. The appeal should describe your basis for believing that Treasury OIG possesses records to which access has been wrongly denied, or that we have otherwise violated applicable FOIA law or policy.
